FOUNDATION COURSE IN SAFETY DATA SHEETS & LABELS

P-E COURSE CODE: TROHS 007

OUTLINE

Participants will be instructed on the basic knowledge and skills to be able to interpret Safety Data Sheets and labels to assist in the safe use, storage, handling and disposal of chemicals in the workplace.

PRE-REQUISITES:

There are no pre-requisites, however, participants will find it useful if they have some prior knowledge of the relevant substances and SDS' used in their workplace.

DURATION:

6 hours (one day)

This course is usually delivered as in-house classroom-based workshops for small groups (including remotely via TEAMS or ZOOM).

- Summary of the SDS and label requirements
- Understanding terms such as:
 - o Hazardous Chemicals c/t Hazardous Substance, Dangerous Goods,
 - o GHS pictograms and Signal words
 - o Hazard and Precautionary Statements c/t Risk and Safety Phrases
 - o Hazard Categories
 - o Dangerous Goods Classes
 - o Biological Exposure Indices (BEI)
 - Time Weighted Average (TWA)
 - Short Term Exposure Limit (STEL)
 - Peak Exposure Limit (PEL)
 - o LC50 / LD50
 - Chemical Health Effects
- Practical exercises to identify and interpret SDS information such as:
 - Emergency Contacts
 - o Health Hazards
 - First Aid advice
 - o Precautions for safe use
 - Engineering Controls
 - Personal Protection
 - Storage & Transport
 - Spills/Leaks & Clean-Up advice
 - o Disposal information
